Summer School Details

- Four days a week for four weeks (Monday-Thursday)
- Six hours of daily programming, including two hours of ELA, two hours of math, and one hour of intervention

Summer School Goals

- Leverage our high-quality instructional materials strategically to address learning loss and accelerate student learning during summer school.
- Provide additional practice with grade-level text, evidence-based discussions, and evidence-based writing tasks that will deepen students' literacy skills and build background knowledge and vocabulary.
- Improve students' writing skills. Specifically, to provide students with explicit instruction and targeted practice with the writing type they did not cover during the school year (opinion/argument, informative/explanatory, or narrative) —with the support of the Wit & Wisdom writing models and targeted academic feedback.

High-Quality Instructional Materials

- Our adopted ELA Curriculum in 3-5 is Wit & Wisdom.
- We are not on pace to complete the Wit & Wisdom scope and sequence by the end of the school year.
