

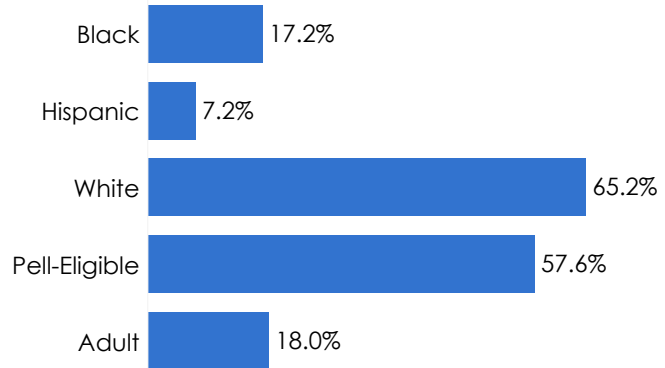

- 1 178,745 students were enrolled full-time in Tennessee's public postsecondary systems in Fall 2022.
- 2 The rate of Tennessee Promise applicants melting over the summer increased across all student groups from 2019-20 to 2021-22.
- 3 The first-to-second-year retention rate at Tennessee public community colleges and public universities has increased for White students, but decreased for Black, Hispanic, and Pell-eligible students.
- 4 Five years after graduating, the median annual wage for Black students is around 12 percent less than the median annual wage for White or Hispanic graduates.

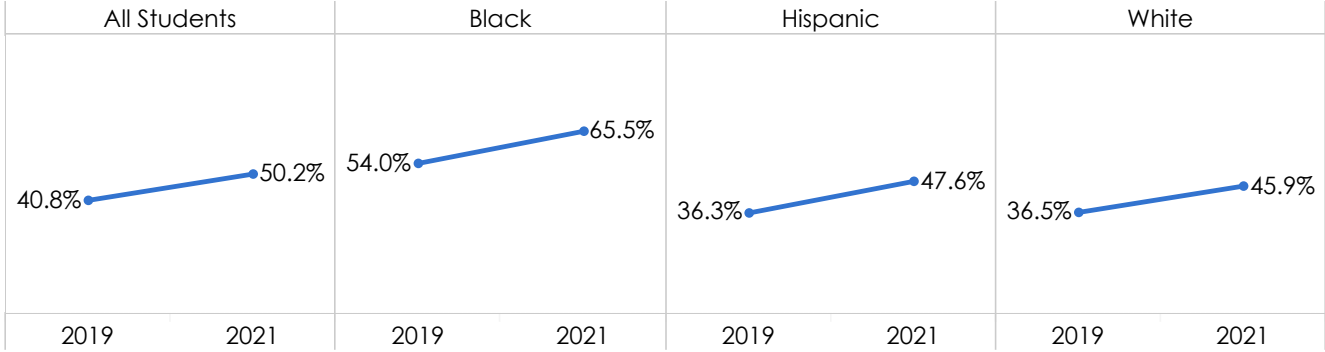

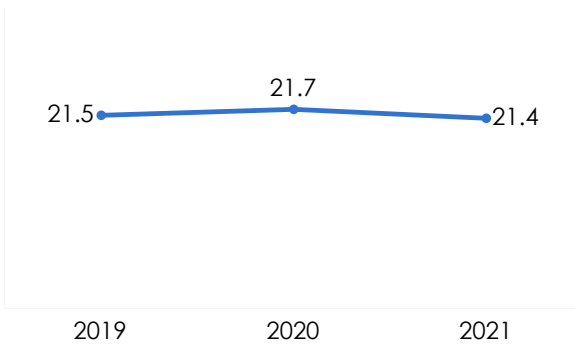

All Students Performance Over Time



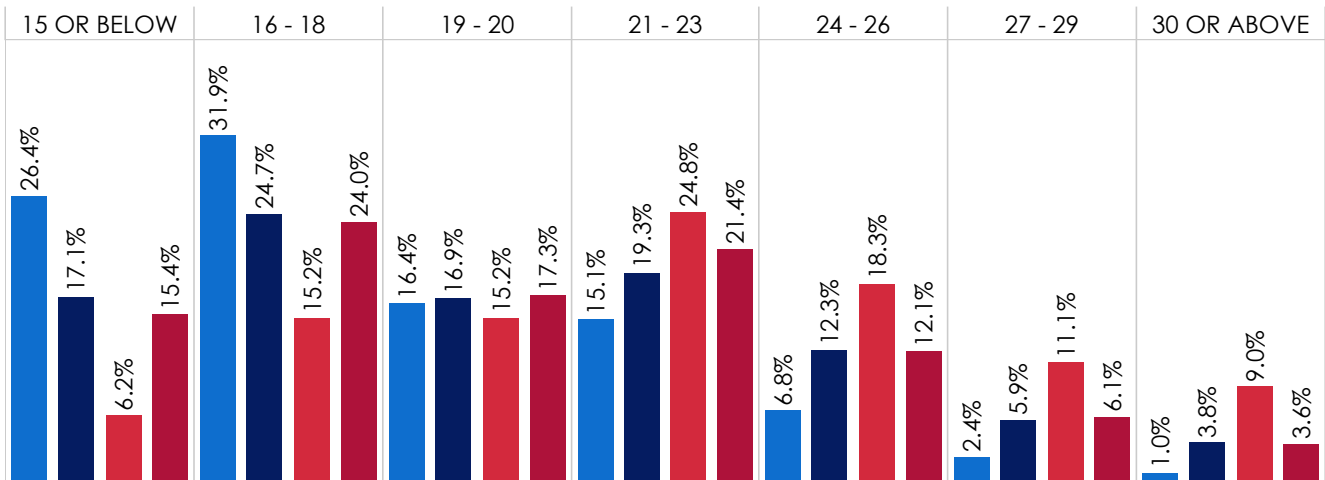
2021 Performance By Student Group

 ■ Pell-Eligible

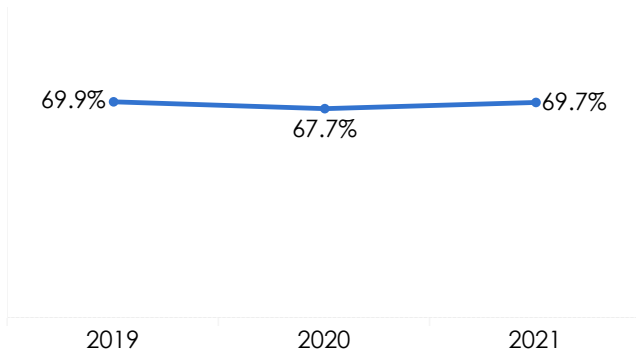




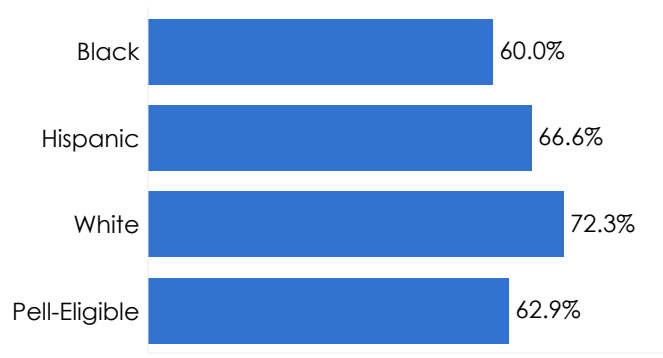

All Students Performance Over Time

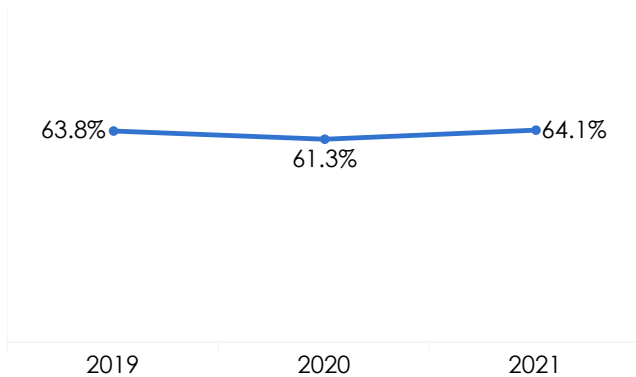


2021 Performance By Student Group

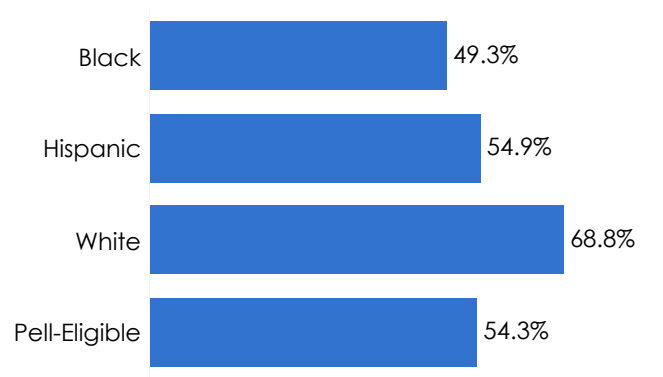


Rate Of Students Earning At Least 24 Credits In Year One

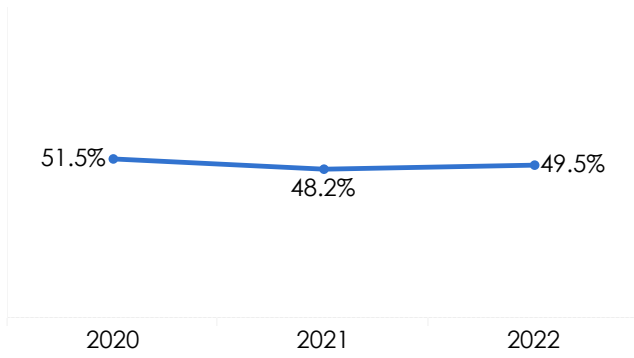




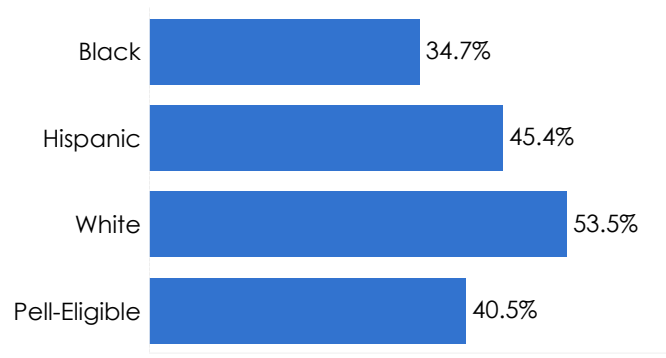

All Students Performance Over Time

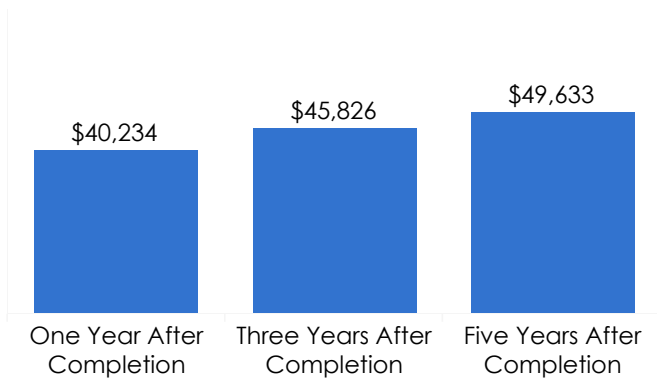


2022 Performance By Student Group
